


Merry Christmas and a Very Happy New Year!



LEARN A RHYME, MAKE A TOY, PLAY OUTSIDE

Late Fall brought clouds of "fairy flies" which we had never seen before as we are new in these woodsy parts. It is easy to understand why they are called fairy flies with their thin black wings and puffy white bodies. They are also called "woolly aphids" and are in fact, surprisingly enough, tiny wasps. The way they float around us as if they were trying to

get our attention is magical. We wondered about tales of huge bears, ghostly cougars, fairies and the like reported by people who explore the many dirt roads that go deep into the birch and white pine forests. For these wild places hold their own. Boon myths of faun and goblin still. And have a lingering good-will. For folk in green if truth were known. Oh, what a delightful fear. Let's "hush, listen and hear" as Lucy Maud Montgomery wrote in her poem The Wild Places.



Now playing outside in early December can be challenging but it is a perfect time to plan and make a fairy village. First, you will need to go outside and collect a bunch of small branches or twigs as well as tips from evergreens. Large or thin popsicle sticks can do the job. You can also collect small flat rocks and small pieces of beach wood. Then you will need to gather small plastic or sturdy cardboard containers from the recycling bin. You will need glue, scissors, and markers or paint. Cut the branches to fit the containers and stick them as if they were logs covering the walls. Then put the tips on top to make the roof. You can also fold a piece of felt to make a cone shape roof as if the house was wearing a hat. Whimsical features for fairy houses are always in style. You can cut out a door and windows or just paint them on. Make two or three houses and there you have it: a fairy village! As the cold weather comes around, make ice cubes in the freezer, and use them to build fences around the houses. Add bigger

branches and make them stand upright for trees. In a safe place outside, on the deck or in the back yard, choose a nice setting to put your fairy houses. With rocks, sand, or food coloring, make small pathways for the fairies. Grandparents, this activity is a guaranteed success that will have grandchildren asking to come over and play. The pleasure of imagination is far more powerful than the one of video games!!

The children might have little fairy figurines to play with; if not you can make some. We were amazed at all the different fairies that can be created with household things like cotton, strings, rubber bands, buttons, and wires. On the Internet there are many different videos for children and adults that explain step by step how to create them. Once you've made them, hang them at the end of a string attached to a stick and make them fly! When all is done and it's time for hot chocolate, ask the children to tell the story of their fairies. You can create a story book and add to it every time the children come to visit.


