

My name is Katelyn, and I am a part-time Occupational Therapist working at the Central Miramichi Community Health Center in Doaktown. I wanted to explain my role here, and the types of services that I will be able to provide.

The purpose of OT services is to enable people to be as independent and safe as possible during everyday activities. Life is made up of meaningful everyday activities or occupations such as walking the dog, gardening, preparing a meal, and bathing. The goal is for people to be able to take care of themselves (self-care), and to engage both in productive activities and leisure (the activities we do for fun). The occupational therapist assesses the impact of physical, mental, emotional, and developmental issues on a person's ability to engage in self-care, productivity, and social/leisure activities. Priorities for treatment are identified through collaboration with the client and their treatment team. The aim of treatment is to build on strengths, overcome barriers and enhance people's satisfaction participation their dailv with in livina activities.

Examples of outpatient OT interventions include but are not limited to:

- Prescribing: assistive aids such as dressing aids, raised toilet seats, bath seats, etc.
- Educating: joint protection, energy conservation, fall prevention, sleep hygiene.
- Education: basic meal planning/preparation, independent living skills, home safety.
- Referring clients to other agencies and services.
- Upper extremity splinting.
- Adapting regularly used items so that clients can be independent in their use (e.g. making handles of utensils bigger so that someone with pain in their fingers can hold and use them).

Providing strategies that a person with memory/cognitive challenges problems could use to help them complete activities.

If you have any questions regarding OT services at the CMCHC, please don't hesitate to contact me at 365-6100. You can also talk to your primary health care provider about OT services or call and self-refer (you do not need a referral from your health care provider to access Occupational Therapy services).



Feel the need to get outdoors, get your hands dirty, and grow something wonderful??

The Doaktown Community Garden -- in conjunction with the Doak Provincial Heritage Site - suggest that it's time to start thinking about gardening. Be it vegetables or flowers, we have the raised beds (and all the materials you'll need) to get you started - all YOU need to do is a bit of regular weeding and watering, then sit back and watch things burst into life.

We have 30 raised beds available and we can provide the soil, fertilizer, watering cans, and hoses. Thanks to our friends at *Joey's Independent Grocer*, we even have seeds -- vegetables (think cucumber, tomatoes, carrots, lettuce, onions, peppers, and peas), herbs and even sunflower and wild flower seeds. Rentals are only \$10 per bed but we will require you to keep your bed and the ground around it neat and tidy (waste containers for weeds and other debris will be provided).

The Doaktown Community Garden is located on the grounds of the Doak Provincial Heritage Site at 386 Main Street, Doaktown. 

Do you love fly fishing and have a child or grandchild with whom you'd like to share the fun and satisfaction of the sport? Have you a friend who has often said, "I'd love to take up fly fishing for Atlantic salmon, but I don't know where to start"? If so, on Saturday, June 25 and on Sunday, June 26, the Miramichi Salmon Association will

host its 10<sup>th</sup> annual *First Cast MSA*, a *free* event for everyone (young and old) who is eager to learn about the sport of fly fishing for Atlantic salmon. This is an excellent opportunity for a "relatively experienced" fisherman to bring along someone who is new to the sport and, with the help of volunteers from the MSA, participate in a two-day mentoring experience guaranteed to be the start of a life-time of fly fishing and a new appreciation for our natural environment where our cherished Atlantic salmon roam.

Saturday's activities will take place at the Atlantic Salmon Museum in Doaktown and will include a casual classroom session, a tour of the Museum, and riverside casting instruction. On Sunday, there will be a full day of supervised fishing at a private camp on the Miramichi.
