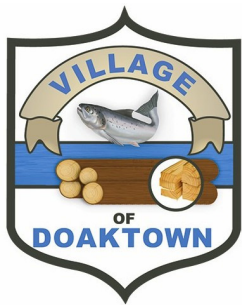

NOTICE FROM THE VILLAGE OF DOAKTOWN WATER & SEWER DEPARTMENT

On April 1, 2023, all overdue Water and Waste Water accounts will be reviewed and action taken to bring the accounts up to date or disconnections will be imminent. The invoices delivered in January 2023 are not due until the last date on your invoice (June 30, 2023 for semi-annual customers and December 31, 2023 for yearly customers).

We encourage anyone interested in making payment arrangements to contact the Village Office. Payment arrangements for overdue amounts can be made over a six-month period (your outstanding overdue balance will be divided into six equal payments from April – September 30, 2023).

Failure to honor the payment arrangement will result in immediate disconnection in services. Once a disconnection is made, the service will not be reactivated until all arrears are paid in full and all future services must be kept up to date.

Village Council is empathetic and very aware of the severity of inflation rates; unfortunately, the water and sewer system is not funded by property tax transfers so, in order to maintain the reliability of this service, we must make collections on overdue accounts.

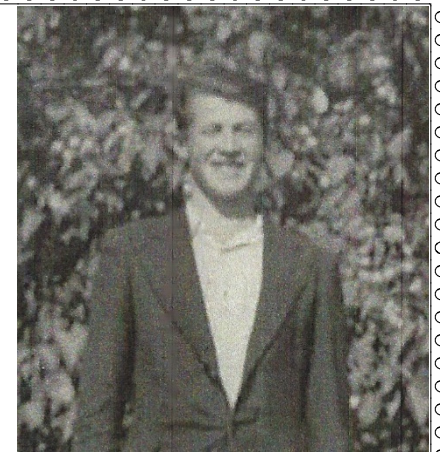

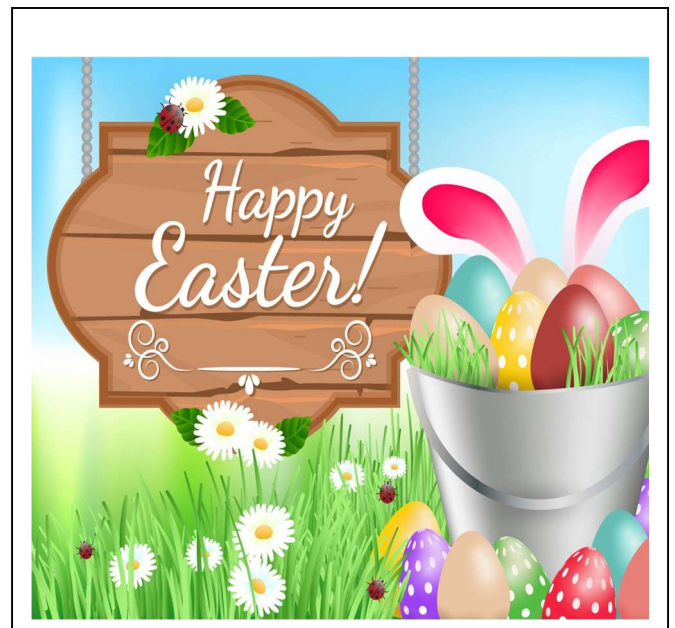

**LEARN A RHYME, MAKE A TOY,
PLAY OUTSIDE**



So it seems that the last frost can make us wait till the end of May and even the beginning of June before we can start our flower gardens and vegetable patches! Something is sprouting in my garden as the snow is receding – maybe it's daffodils or maybe even peonies! One thing is for sure as Lucy Maud Montgomery wrote: *"When a new moon shines after the sunset, in the heart of the mellow southwest, and the winds astray in the meadows are bent on their summertime quest."*

The sunshine is warmer, days are longer and the light is crispier, aren't they? So let's not wait to start growing things. You'll need water, some potting mix, some light and warmth from the noon day sun by the window. Keep your old potatoes and cut the pieces which have an eye or small round dent on them. Stick the pieces into a big pot filled with earth, put it by the window and watch what happens. Don't forget to water them at least once a week. In no time, you'll have potato plants and by the end of summer you'll be able to dig up brand new potatoes. Or try taking the foot or bottom of a celery and sit it in an inch of water in a shallow tray. It will create a new plant with leaves and roots and all! When the roots are nice and strong, place the celery into a small pot so the roots can grow until you can replant it into the garden. It also works with lettuce, carrots, and Bok choy. Your basil plant you got from the store is dying? Cut off a few branches and put them in a glass of water. Roots will form and you'll be able to put them in pots and have new plants. It works with mint too!

Growing roots in water is a lot of fun. Children love to do this because leaves and roots grow quite fast. You can try growing all sorts of vegetables like onions, garlic, and shallots. Try turnips and cabbage! Collect seeds from fruits and from vegetables like beans. Put a few of them in a paper towel, wet them, put them in a plastic sandwich bag and tape the bag to the window facing the warm sun. When leaves start to grow, and roots appear, plant them in small pots until the garden outside is ready. It's all about science and discovery, pre-mathematical skills like classifying and measuring, motor skills like handling fragile plants, and language and communications. A few more weeks to go until outside gardening – let's gather those kitchen scraps!
