Where did April showers come from?

The saying can be traced back to England from the 1500s poet Thomas Tusser. Back then, he wrote “Sweet April showers do spring May Flowers”



The phrase “April showers bring May flowers” is a popular saying used often during the month of April. This is typically the time when the last bit of snow turns to all rain as temperatures climb, and increased rain shower activity sparks the beginning of flowers and plants to really start blooming.



Did you know?

The fly-fishing season on the Miramichi River runs for six months from the opening on the 15th of April until closing on the 15th of October. This is the **longest fishing season** for Atlantic salmon in **the world**.





Spring has arrived! This time of the year often brings a sense of starting over. Doaktown and our neighbours are starting over and doing a reset in the way we do our banking. For many years Scotiabank has served this area and served us well. They have decided to move on and provide banking from urban centers and rely solely on travel or on-line service for rural Canada. Many residents want to remain banking the way they did for decades, understandable, but it is not a reality. Scotiabank is leaving, and no other financial institution will move into a rural area to set up shop.

A concerned group decided to form a financial institution committee, and we were determined to bring a “brick and mortar” bank or credit union to our community. Many contacts were attempted or made, and the committee faced outright rejection or no response at all.

Then CIBC reached out to us and together we developed a plan to bring a new form of banking to the area. CIBC wants to create a model that fits rural Canada, and they have proven to be “all in.” They are utilizing Doaktown and the surrounding areas as an example for other small rural communities that have faced the same loss. The Fredericton team has been forthright, hardworking, open to the needs of the Village, and they are fully supported by their corporate level.

So, the question many ask is, “How does it look”? This was addressed at a Town Hall meeting on Thursday, March 14, at the Doaktown Legion. On March 20, CIBC came to Doaktown for their first official business day for the start of a new era in banking. They are taking six appointments every Wednesday. All you need to do is call (506) 458-9147 ext. 231 and let them know you are from Doaktown or area and would like to make an appointment.

Obviously, participation is simply the only path to success! Eventually, through a sound business plan, we will get a “state of the art” ATM and develop new ways to provide all forms of banking. There will also be a mobile banking truck on site in April and May to assist in requirements for deposits and cash. The absolute best way to find out all the details is to book an appointment and provide details on what your banking needs are.

As a committee or municipal council, we cannot tell you where or how to bank. To support your community and the residents that find it difficult to travel or do on-line banking, jump onboard and be a part of the solution.

In closing, it is very normal to be afraid and leery of the unknown, but the best remedy is to educate yourself and then decide. My thought is, you will be pleasantly impressed with where we can go with this era of doing business!

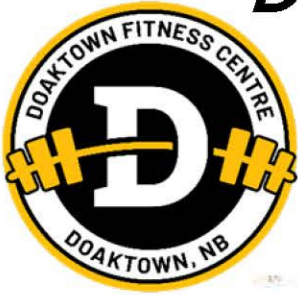

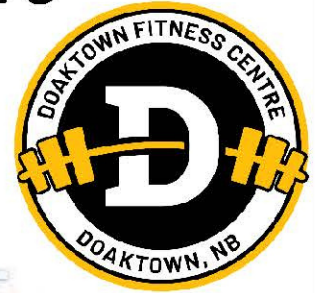

Learn a Rhyme, Make a Toy & Play Outside

Lilac trees, rose bushes and magnolias are budding. Daylight is brighter, and days are warmer and longer. It's time to stop and take notice with our little ones.

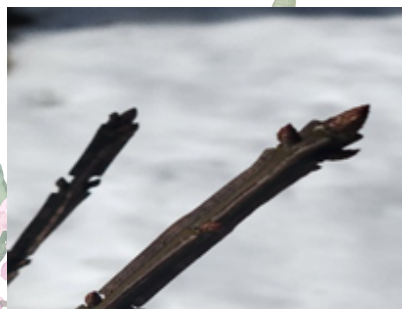
One might think that young children and babies are not interested in nature, but nature is very much part of their human heritage. They breathe the air, see the light, hear the sounds, taste flavors, feel the space and touch things. They are much more capable than we think! Did you know that a twelve-month-old is capable of "noticing and being aware" so we can bring things to their attention and invite them to touch and manipulate. Taking them outside to look at buds on trees and bushes every other day and showing your surprise, interest and fascination will call on their attention span. They will feel the moment and notice the small changes on the growing plants. But careful! No touching the baby flowers!

Around the age of twenty-four months, children acquire "consciousness of self and get a sense of the structure of things" so they know that things are made of parts that come together. They are aware of "sequences and are interested in symbols and words". Back outside to look at the buds growing and the leaves coming out to learn new words like trunk, branches, bark, leaves, and growing baby flowers. Young children that age can know that something is fragile and are able to respect simple rules like no touching!! Around two years old they can appreciate the picture or a drawing of a flower and love putting them up at eye level in their playroom or bedroom.

Three-year-olds are particularly interested in sounds. Granted that baby flowers don't make much noise, but the children do enjoy stories and rhythms so, making up a story about you and them looking out for buds and observing how they bloom, making drawings about the adventure, coloring them, and binding them with a piece of wool or string will be so much fun. Three-year-olds do get excited about things, and they are particularly sensitive.

By the time children are four years old, they become aware of "quantities, value and the phenomenon of cause to effect". Their growing minds can manage more information. They can understand that the buds need warmth and sunshine to bloom. They can grasp that plants need water and food to produce flowers, and that flowers will offer seeds so the plant can multiply. The adventure becomes boundless, and their knowledge will bloom like the flowers in our gardens.

If young children don't understand things intellectually, they make sense of them with their feelings, their emotions, and their soul. Yes! Their soul is budding under their skin like that of a flower bud under the bark of a plant or tree. It's up to us adults to cherish and nurture their growth and awakening and their discovery of springtime delights.
