## The Origins of XOXO


The X became synonymous with a kiss in medieval times. At that time people could not even write their name, so instead they would write an X and kiss it to prove that they were honest.

Municipal Budget. More specifically, regarding restrictions faced by Municipal Government and the major fixed costs that drive the bottom line. In 2023 Municipal Reform brought the Parish of Blissfield (POB) into the Village of Doaktown (VOD), two entities that had two tax rates with a large gap separating them. The Village Council was mandated to bring the POB rate even with the VOD by 2028 (five years). In order to operate effectively, the tax rates need to be increased in order to close this gap within five years to become equal. The newly joined POB will face substantial increases every year. The facilitator, that coached Council and staff, during the initial process of the Municipal Reform, made an error in calculating tax rates. Once this was identified by staff and brought to the attention of the Provincial Government, they provided a grant for the last fiscal


Another significant contributor to determining our budget and what Council can spend on preventive maintenance, beautification, upgrades to facilities, roads, and streets are fixed costs from outside. These items are set by outside agencies and take the majority of monies allotted to the Village. Policing 18%, Garbage 9.3%, Insurance 8.6%, and Regional Service Commission, are a few of the more substantial costs.

year to compensate for their error. The grant was expected to ease the burden yearly until the five year process was complete. The Village Council requested the

Council will continue to work on projects and reach out to Federal and Provincial Governments for financial assistance, and we will also work with stakeholders in our community to fund improvements in the Village of Doaktown.

I will leave you with one last thought, "It doesn't mean you are not supporting your party if you question their decisions". We must ensure that our representatives at the Federal and Provincial level know we deserve sufficient money to operate. We have a voice, and it is more powerful if spoken by all.

## Learn a Rhyme, Make a Toy & Play Outside

Remember the pleasures of feeling alive, breathing the cold crisp winter air, tasting fresh snowflakes, being mesmerized by large floating Christmas snow, being charmed by diamonds in the snow shining in the sunlight or waking up to see fascinating frost patterns on your bedroom window. So many things to look for and enjoy in winter with children. With a little research on your phone or computer, you can create free activities to help children learn new words, relations and concepts, and keep alive feelings of amazement, fascination, and surprise. Seeing a live puffed chickadee sitting on a branch covered with snow, listening to it chirping, wishing it would eat off your hand, and realizing it is actually looking at you is a real live human experience – the type of experience that keeps children connected with nature through all their senses. Think about when you step on new thin ice and how it makes the sound of breaking glass. It is a fascinating experience as you need just the right pressure with your foot to break the ice and hear the sound. The sheet of ice is kind of white and is not really transparent. It seems to have crystallized over air pockets. When it breaks, it creates all different patterns. One has to wonder about ice. It forms because of temperature and pressure and is different if it forms with fresh or salt water. There are all these different names for ice. For example, there is pack ice, ice breccia, brash ice or slush, floeberg ice, glaze ice or black ice on pavements, nilas ice and frazil ice. There are also different crystal forms for ice like cubic, tetragonal, monodinic, rhombohedral and non-crystalline. A world of wonders to notice and explore!

February is upon us, and the rays of sunshine are brighter and warmer. Did you notice? It is always this time of winter when I am reminded of my garden because seeds placed in humid earth in small containers by a south or south-west windows can and will sprout. It's a good time to start off basil, parsley, rosemary, sage, and oregano to get them ready for Easter offerings. Seeds are already in stores. A bit of potting earth and recycled plastic bottles with holes in the bottom, and there you have it! Fun to watch during the remaining cold winter days.
